KEY PROJECTS IMPLEMENTED:

HEALTH SECTOR:



Organized treatment days in Aswar Camp, Gezira State, serving 1,400 patients. Partnered with Soda Voice Organization for treatment days in shelter centres in Wad Madani.

Held blood donation campaigns in Wad Madani and Dongola, collecting 350 units in each city.

Provided eye care services, including free medical glasses, through partnerships with specialists

Conducted health campaigns targeting 520 patients in Dongola in collaboration with the International Organization for Migration (IOM), and other NGOs.

Performing cataract eye surgeries for more than 1,000 individuals in collaboration with Nileen University - Faculty of Optometry.

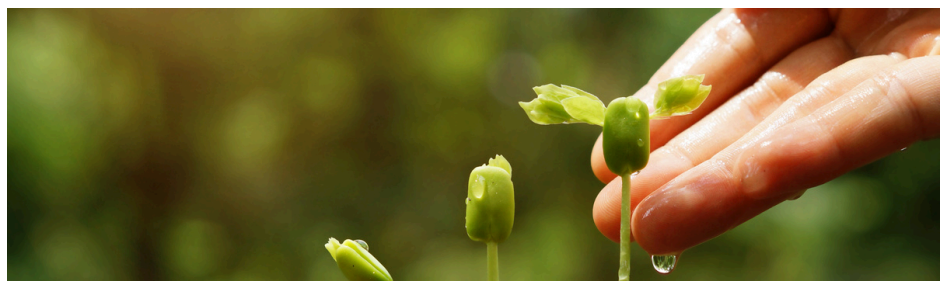

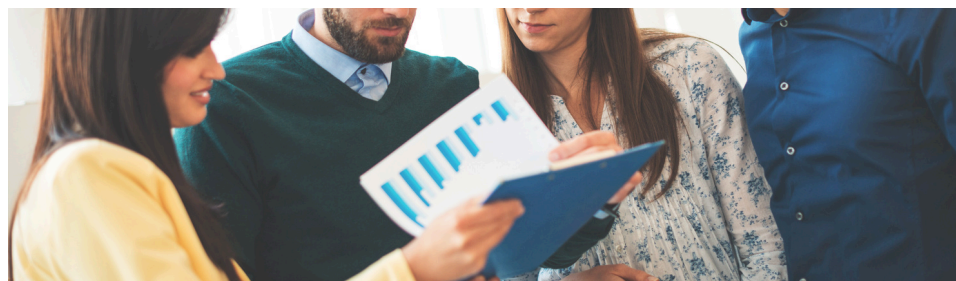
